During the project, we have updated and created about 50 courses by a team of highly qualified specialists from Belarus, Germany, Denmark, Finland, and Poland.

About 200 students took part in piloting the upgraded courses. About 50 companies actively collaborated with the project, teachers and students.



Together we made it possible and showed that even during a pandemic, an unstable political situation, professionals in their field remain true to themselves and continue to work no matter what!



The process has been launched and MACICT methods will continue to be used, because the feedback has shown high interest and involvement at various stakeholders levels.

For three years at MACICT, we have solved a number of tasks:

1. Modernized the existing MSc curriculum in ICT using the best practices of EU partners - strategies, pedagogical approaches and teaching methods to support the professional knowledge and skills required in the modern labor market.

2. Modernized the existing ICT Master's program and included new interdisciplinary courses to equip students with the competitive knowledge, soft skills needed to enter the job market, pursue successful careers in existing companies, or start their own business.

3. Accredited the program.

4. Developed and applied a strategy, guidelines and quality assurance principles to improve the modernized curriculum by involving undergraduates and the labor market in the assessment and further improvement of the master's degree.

5. At the pilot stage, we launched a modernized master's program.

6. Facilitated the cooperation of students from the EU and Belarus through the implementation of projects to solve real-life problems by international student groups.

7. Ensured the quality of the program and made the necessary improvements in subsequent stages.

The fulfillment of these tasks helped to change the pedagogical views, approaches and methods of teaching by teachers in Belarus, changing the outlook of students and their adaptability to society, changes in the labor market, in which graduates of the modernized interdisciplinary magistracy discovered better job opportunities for themselves.

About 10 students have already received employment thanks to the project.
